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The Follow Up tab includes score boxes for Self Care, Sphincter Control, Transfers, Locomotion, communications, Expression, and Social Cognition, with subcategories for each. When you enter the scores, FIM provides a Motor Subtotal and a Cognitive Subtotal, along with a Total Score (FIM Total Score).

The UK FIM-FAM is designed for measuring disability in the brain-injured population. It has an ordinal scoring system for all 30 items from 1-7 (1=complete dependence and 7 fully independent). Scoring is conducted at 2 time points □ approximately 7-10 days after admission (admission score) and within 7 days of discharge (discharge score).

Key Descriptions. Contains 18 items composed of: 1) 13 motor tasks. 2) 5 cognitive tasks (considered basic activities of daily living) Tasks are rated on a 7-point ordinal scale that ranges from total assistance (or complete dependence) to complete independence. Scores range from 18 (lowest) to 126 (highest) indicating level of function.

A score of one means that you require total assistance for the activity. Therefore, the minimum score on the FIM is 18, and the maximum score is 126, which indicates complete independence. A complete list of scores for the FIM is as follows: 1 □

~~The Role of the FIM in Physical Therapy~~

The FIM instrument comprises 18 items, each of which is assessed against a seven-point ordinal scale, where the higher the score for an item, the more independently the patient is able to perform the tasks assessed by that item. Total scores range from 18 to 126.

In scoring FIMs in the EATING category O (activity did not occur) is an acceptable number. But, it's rare. Eating is an activity that happens to most of us on a daily basis. If a person is unable to eat he/she may have a PEG or are receiving TPN, IV feedings.
